Dear Student,

Firstly, hello and welcome to Bicton College. Hopefully you are just as excited about coming to study here as much as we are to welcome you. There is quite a lot of information to read and digest and so we recommend taking time to go through each section in turn to fully understand all the details.

Applications received after the 24th July 2023 will be allocated accommodation on a case by case basis if accommodation is available otherwise you will be put on a waiting list.

ROOM ALLOCATION

Room allocation is undertaken fairly and is designed to ensure maximum student enjoyment and access to the education students want.

We allocate rooms based upon individual student needs and where possible we aim to provide students their first choice of accommodation type. Rooms will only be allocated once the payment is received.

We prioritise the following:

- Students under 18s years old.
- Students who do not live within reasonable travelling distance to the College.
- Students who require full-time, term time accommodation.
- Students with a disability/support needs.
- Returning students.

We aim to accommodate students who may have specific and/or additional needs. However, there may be times when this is not possible. Please contact the Residential Team Lead to discuss requirements.

ACCOMMODATION AVAILABLE

The cost of residential accommodation at is based on two elements:

- **Room:** There is a choice of room options are available. The accommodation fees include the room for the duration of the academic year with occupancy during term time only. The accommodation fees include all bills (excluding food and drink), access to social areas and activities and 24/7 support from staff.
- Food: All rooms, with the exception of self-catering options, must also select a food package to ensure appropriate access to sustenance whilst living on site. Please select the most appropriate package based on the likely use of accommodation (eg: weekdays only, weekend stays, timetable for 3 days on campus etc). Students will be issued with a personal catering card which will be credited with the amount selected in your food package. Each Sunday, any remaining credit will be removed and the new credit will be applied so select the best package for your stay. Residential students purchasing their meals* with their catering card will receive a discount in the college canteen (*Meals only, not snacks or drinks). Additional food can also be purchased through cash / card payments at any time and catering cards can be topped up in year.

- A £100 non-refundable fee is payable on application and we will not process your application until
 this fee is paid. It will be retained by the college to cover costs such as administration, PAT testing,
 Laundry etc. In the event of your application being unsuccessful then this fee will be refunded in
 full.
- Accommodation fees are based on the room cost and selected food package for the year. You will
 receive one invoice for this full accommodation cost.
- Your accommodation contract is for the full academic year in order to allocate the room for use
 during term time for the full academic year. The accommodation fees are still payable in the case
 of any absence including work experience, study tours, sickness or choosing to commute rather
 than stay in your booked accommodation.
- If the accommodation is vacated by the accommodation occupant (including if the student is excluded) before the end of the academic year then fees are chargeable for the remainder of the academic year. This will only be reviewed in exceptional circumstances.
- Payment of fees is arranged on an individual basis and can be either 10 monthly instalments by direct debit, termly or paid in advance for the whole year.
- The full invoice of payment fees, OR the first payment of a payment plan, MUST be made by 31st
 August 2023 to confirm the accommodation and to provide access to accommodation in time for
 the first day of term.
- Students may not stay in residence during non-term time. Agreed start and end dates of each term will dictate when students must arrive and leave their accommodation. The accommodation fees take into account these non-term weeks.
- Any damages sustained to college property will be invoiced to the fee guarantor.
- For all students, a guarantor (who is over 25) will be required to sign the accommodation contract and adequate payment arrangements made before the student enters accommodation.

RESIDENTIAL BURSARY / FINANCIAL SUPPORT

We are pleased to be able to provide access to a residential bursary to help with some of the cost of accommodation.

This is available to those with a household income of £50,000 or less. Other criteria must also be met. You can find out more and apply for a bursary by visiting <u>Bicton.ac.uk/accommodation</u>.

RESIDENTIAL ACCOMMODATION TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The accommodation occupant (student), parent / guardian and / or bill payer must read the Terms and Conditions carefully before signing this agreement and by doing so hereby agree to the terms and conditions as stated below.

Cornwall College reserves the right to refuse accommodation to any student who breaks the Terms and Conditions and students are also bound by the college's disciplinary procedures and may be asked to vacate the accommodation with immediate effect.

- 1. The accommodation occupant agrees to abide by the regulations relating to the college accommodation, printed in the Residents Handbook or other College publications. The College reserves the right to change, or put in place, rules if they are deemed beneficial for the College community.
- 2. The room is for the use of the accommodation occupant only. Other persons are not permitted to make use of the room during the absence of the accommodation occupant.
- 3. A £100 non-refundable application fee is payable when applying for accommodation. If your application is successful it will be retained by the College to cover services such as administration, PAT testing, laundry etc.
- 4. Your accommodation contract is for the full academic year in order to allocate the room for use during term time for the full academic year. The accommodation fees are still payable in the case of any absence including work experience, study tours, sickness or choosing to commute rather than stay in your booked accommodation.

- 5. The full invoice of payment fees, OR the first payment of a payment plan, MUST be made by 31st
 August 2023 to confirm the accommodation and to provide access to accommodation in time for the first day of term.
- 6. If the accommodation is vacated by the accommodation occupant (including if the student is excluded) before the end of the academic year then fees are chargeable for the remainder of the academic year. This will only be reviewed in exceptional circumstances.
- 7. Where the accommodation occupant intends to apply for a residential bursary, it should be noted that they are responsible for the **full** amount of the fees until all the required documentary evidence has been provided AND the bursary has been agreed and confirmed by the college. This applies in all cases including failure to apply, failure of application, or exhaustion of funds available. The bursary will be allocated on a term by term basis. If the accommodation is vacated by the accommodation occupant (including if the student is excluded) before the end of the academic year, the bursary will be recalculated to only support the dates in which the accommodation was in use. Awarding of the successful bursary is based on meeting the criteria and providing evidence, agreeing to the bursary and accommodation terms and conditions, and is subject to availability.
- If the accommodation occupant wishes to move to a different room they can only do so subject to availability and with the approval of the Residential Team Lead. Thereafter the rental applicable to the new room will be applied and the appropriate adjustment will be made to the accommodation fees. Any payment plans previously agreed will be amended to ensure all fees are collected prior to the end of the tenancy agreement.
- All students will be required to attend Compulsory meetings throughout the year. These will include subjects on The Residential Induction, Drugs and Alcohol Awareness, Mental Health Awareness, Safeguarding. They will also be required to attend block meetings throughout the year. They must also keep in touch through agreed communication channels to keep up to date with residential information.
- 10. It is the responsibility of the accommodation occupant to clean their room (including shared areas). Continued failure to keep the room to a reasonable standard may result in Campus Services deep cleaning the room for which there will be a £50 charge. The College cleaners will not clean bodily fluids (e.g. vomit) if these are found in the room or in communal bathroom areas you will again be charged for a deep clean at the commercial rate of up to £100.
- 11. The College may move accommodation occupants into alternative accommodation on campus with one week's notice.
- 12. The accommodation occupant must have a set of keys at all times. Should the occupant lose a key and/or fob then these will be replaced at a cost of £25.
- 13. It is against the law for Under 18s to drink alcohol on site. No alcohol is to be consumed by Under 18s or to be kept in their rooms. Anyone signing out for the evening is not permitted to return to site under the influence of alcohol. Failure to follow these rules will result in action in line with the Behaviour and Misconduct Policy and could lead to exclusion from accommodation. Next of Kin will be contacted and may be asked to collect you from campus.
- 14. It is a criminal offence for over 18s to buy or provide alcohol to any under 18 students. If any residential student is identified of doing this, it will result in action in line with the Behaviour and Misconduct Policy and could lead to exclusion from accommodation. The police may also notified which could incur a fine of up to £2,000.
- Over 18s. Whilst over 18s are allowed to drink alcohol this must be conducted within the following rules: Alcohol can only be consumed in the social area in their own block. Alcohol should not be over

- 20% volume. No alcohol is to be consumed on campus other than stated above. This is to minimise alcohol related disturbances and maintain a safe healthy campus.
- Our campus is predominantly a non-smoking site and smoking (including the use of e-cigarettes/vapes) is only allowed in the permitted designated area. Failure to follow these rules will result in action in line with the Behaviour and Misconduct Policy and could lead to exclusion from accommodation.
- 17. The College will not tolerate students engaging in drug use. Non-prescription drugs (including psychoactive substances formally called legal highs) or drug paraphernalia are not allowed on campus at any time. Anyone caught in possession of drugs or drug paraphernalia, using, sharing, gifting or dealing will be subject a behaviour review in line with the Behaviour and Misconduct Policy. This could lead to exclusion from accommodation or the College. We will also be required to report this to the Police.
- 18. Over 18s must not be present in under 18s blocks after 10.30pm and under 18s must be in their own blocks by 11pm when the Residential Services team will carry out night-time checks. No under 18s should be out of their accommodation block after this time.
- 19. No under 18 residential students are allowed in over 18s blocks.
- 20. The College promotes an atmosphere conducive to learning during college hours and should remain sociable outside of these hours. All noise is to cease at 10.30pm. Students making too much noise will be asked to reduce it immediately and will be required to do so at any time during the day or evening. All staff reserve the right to temporarily confiscate items to assist with maintaining a quiet campus.
- 21. All students must sign out and leave their keys in the Residential Services Office if they leave their accommodation or go off-site when they are in residence, including during the day. Students must collect their keys as soon as they return to site which must be between the hours 8.30am and 10.30pm.
- Tampering with fire equipment including the covering of smoke alarms, extinguishers or alarm call points is strictly forbidden. Failure to follow these rules will result in action in line with the Behaviour and Misconduct Policy and could lead to exclusion from accommodation. Any damage must also be paid for.
- The College will not tolerate deliberate damage to any property owned by the College or others. You will be charged for any damage caused by you or your guests. Students must complete the pre-entry room check form in detail and return it on the day of your arrival. Failure to do so may result in you being charged for any pre-existing damage. Damaged or broken items are to be reported immediately to enable the Campus Team to fix and/or replace them. In the case of damage to communal or shared areas, any damage costs will be split between the relevant occupants within the block unless the individual responsible can be identified. The bill payer will be notified of damage costs in writing and given time to respond. Failure to respond within 21 days will result in payment being taken automatically from payment details held by the Finance Department. If no valid payment details are held then this amount will be invoiced.
- ^{24.} The accommodation occupant must vacate their room by 7pm on the last day of each term and hand back all keys issued to them by the College. Students will be notified of the return dates and times and this will also be shared via social media / communication channels.
- 25. Students cannot access the room during non-term time but their belongings can remain unless otherwise requested. However, the College cannot accept any responsibility for any property left at the end of each term. Occupants can only return to campus after 6pm on the day before college starts again. Where the room will be required for use or maintenance outside of term time, students will be

- asked to remove their belongings. We will give at least 2 weeks' notice if this is requested and a secure location can be provided to store the belongings during the non-term time break.
- 26. It is the student / parent / guardian's responsibility to immediately inform Residential Services of any changes in contact details, phone numbers, medical conditions or any other information that might affect the student's welfare.
- We will contact parents / guardians where we have concerns for the wellbeing of any student in accommodation. This will be automatic where a student is aged under 18 on the 31st August 2023, even if they turn 18 during the College year. Where a student is aged 18 or over when they join accommodation, we ask they also give us the right to contact a next of kin in support of their wellbeing. This is an option that can be agreed to in the final agreement section. If we are concerned over the safety and welfare of an over 18 resident who has not given permission, we will still contact the next of kin where we feel this is in the best interests of the student.
- Lost property is recorded and stored for a maximum period of 6 weeks after which time it will be disposed of accordingly.
- 29. Some items are prohibited on campus on Health & Safety grounds (as stated in the Residential Guide). This includes includes joss sticks, candles, oil burners, camping gas, camping stoves, lighter fuel and any items prohibited by the College weapons Policy.
- 30. Any confiscated items will be recorded, labelled and stored until returned to student at an agreed time. Rules and regulations relating to persons living on campus are contained within the Residential handbook which the accommodation occupant is responsible for reading and understanding. If there are any questions relating to the rules and regulations, or an individual requires assistance or the handbook in an alternative format please, see a member of staff from Residential Services in confidence.
- By signing this agreement, the accommodation occupant and parent / guardian / bill payer agrees to be bound by these Terms and Conditions. Breaches of College rules and regulations will result in disciplinary action being taken. This could be a warning, removal of privileges, suspension from College (in some cases this would be immediate), exclusion from residential accommodation or exclusion from College.
- If an accommodation occupant is asked to leave college accommodation on disciplinary grounds, the College can stipulate that this will be effective immediately, especially where the individual's continued presence poses a potential risk to themselves or others at College. In other circumstances the College can stipulate when the accommodation occupant must leave the accommodation. This will not usually be more than 5 days after notification of the decision of exclusion. If the fees are left unpaid the College reserves the right to pass these on to our external collection agency or pursue through the County Court and will be subject to an administration charge.
- Cooling Off Period There will be a period of 14 days 'cooling off' from the point of occupation. During this 14 day period the occupant can be released from their contract if requested in writing to the College. If released from the contract the occupant will remain liable for fees for the duration of their actual stay in college accommodation however the application fee remains non-refundable.
- Supplementary Regulations for Students Under 18 The College endeavours to provide extra support and guidance for students under 18 years of age living in the College residential accommodation and to this end has implemented additional regulations which are set out in our Terms and Conditions and Residential Guide.
 - For the information of parents/guardians: The College cannot accept responsibility for the behaviour and welfare of students who fail to comply with these regulations. Failure to follow these rules will result in action in line with the Behaviour and Misconduct Policy and could lead to exclusion from accommodation.


"Residential learners make good progress from their starting point on admission to the College. They benefit both academically and socially from being residential" (Ofsted, 2018).

We also have a team of staff that offer a variety of sports and entertainment. We provide regular evening activities and various trips. However; this is a learning environment and whilst you are here we have a duty of care for you and your studies. We will make sure that you have access to learning materials, facilities and learning resources to achieve your full potential.
